Mandatory **E-Filing Update**

hief Justice Rebecca White Berch and the Arizona Supreme Court further solidified their dedication to electronic • filing in Arizona by moving forward with a series of phase-in dates for mandatory e-filing. Supreme Court Administrative Order 2010-117 provides details for the planned implementation. The mandatory status of e-filing has several requirements and limitations under the Administrative Order, some of which are:

- Applies to civil cases in Maricopa County only.
- Mandatory for attorneys filing on behalf of a client. Not mandatory for self-represented.
- Civil cases are still initiated on paper with the Clerk of the Superior Court. Mandatory e-filing applies to postinitiation civil case documents only.
- E-filing through AZTurboCourt is available now, but is required by the dates stated in the Administrative Order's phase-in schedule.
- Training is available now through the Supreme Court's Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) and sanctions are authorized for non-compliant counsel.
- Exceptions, costs and definitions are contained within the Administrative Order.

Law firms and attorneys received a related notification directly from the AOC in November, including contact information for training and questions. AZTurboCourt is not operated or maintained by the Clerk of the Superior Court, but the Clerk's Office encourages early adoption of e-filing through AZTurboCourt.
