The parties would submit abstracts of water rights with the understanding that these are all conditional reserved water rights for the 16 springs, and conditional on the determination, some day, of the southwestern boundary of the Tribe. The Special Master would consider having a review every two years for up to four years to review the status of the boundary issue and any other matter that comes up. During this time, the Court would retain jurisdiction over the case or; 3) Conduct a hearing in which the Special Master or the Court would issue a conditional reserved water right following the hearing assuming the parties agree the Special Master and the Court have the authority to grant a conditional reserved right.
